In 2018/19, 61.5% of UoL student population were ≤21, an increase in the proportion from 2017/18 (58.1%). Similarly, 57% of UK students were ≤21 in 2017/18.

• In 2018/19, 67.9% of UoL disabled first degree undergraduate qualifiers received a first/2:1. In the UK, in 2017/18, 74.7% of disabled first degree undergraduate qualifiers received a first/2:1.

• The proportion of BAME students at UoL has steadily increased since 2015/16, in 2018/19 50.6% of all UoL students identified as BAME. In the UK, 23.9% of students identified as BAME in 2017/18.

- In 2018/19, 78% of white students received a first/2.1 compared with 69.1% of BAME students, representing a BAME degree attainment gap of 8.9 percentage points.
- Advance HE reported that in the UK 80.9% of white students received a first/2:1 compared with 67.7% of BAME students in 2017/18, representing a BAME degree attainment gap of 13.2 percentage points.

• In 2018/19, 75.3% of female first degree UG qualifiers received a first/2.1 compared to 71.4% of male first degree UG qualifiers. This aligns with UK figures, in 2017/18, a larger proportion of female first degree undergraduate qualifiers received a first/2:1 than male qualifiers (78.4% compared with 73.5%).
